English literature refers to the study of texts from around the world, written in the English language. These may include novels, poems, stories, and essays, as well as non-fiction and plays. This degree is meant for those who want to transfer to a four year college to pursue a BA in English. Career paths may include writing, teaching, journalism, law, or any field which involves expert use of the English language.

## Curricular Outcomes

At the completion of this curriculum, students should be able to:

- Demonstrate understanding of literary works in context, including the ways texts engage notions of genre, culture, history, class, race, gender, and sexuality.
- Discuss and explicate, orally and in writing, themes, plots, characterization, symbolism and other conventions and practices of literature and literary genres.
- Define and apply vocabulary appropriate to the study of literature and the humanities (e.g., hero, myth, symbols, irony).
- Make connections between literature and their own lives.
- Use a variety of written, verbal, and multimodal forms to respond to and analyze literary texts and contexts

The Associate of Arts Transfer in English (<https://catalog.mhcc.edu/degree-certificate-requirements/aat-english/>) (AAT-English) is a statewide transfer degree designed for students that intend to major in English literature after transferring to an Oregon public university. This degree ensures students complete the English Major Transfer Map (MTM) as well as the Oregon Core Transfer Map (CTM.) Students are highly encouraged to work with a university transfer adviser and MHCC faculty adviser to ensure transferability of courses.

*General education courses (such as math, writing, health, etc.) can be taken during any term, or before starting the program.*

Students must complete all courses with a "C" grade or better, and must have a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.0 at the time the degree is awarded.
